

## **F. W. JOSLYN DIES**

### **Buffalonian prominent in coal trade ill three months**

Frank W. Joslyn, prominent in the coal business in the Great Lakes area for more than 30 years, died yesterday morning in his home, Alliance Apartments, after an illness of three months. Mr. Joslyn's body will be at the Henry Kelly Funeral Parlors, 2850 Main Street, until funeral services tomorrow at 3 p. m. in the chapel at Forest Lawn Cemetery.

Mr. Joslyn was born in Buffalo 58 years ago. After being educated in the Buffalo schools he entered the coal trade and for 33 years was attached to the sales department of the Lehigh Valley Coal Company in Buffalo, Cleveland and Detroit, at one time being manager of the Detroit office. He was a member of Company G of the old 74th Regiment for more than ten years until he went to Detroit.

Returning to Buffalo about a year ago, Mr. Joslyn continued in the coal business under his own name until he was stricken ill. He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Mary F. Joslyn; a daughter, Mrs. Robert F. Bueschen; a sister, Marcia, and a brother, Chauncey D. Joslyn of Cleveland.
