Know all men by these presents, That we *Alvin Stocking*
Alvin Joslin, John M. Minner and Ephraim B. Groullet
all of the County of Bradford are held and firmly bound unto the

commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in the sum of *one thousand dollars*
lawful money, to be paid to the said commonwealth; to which payment well and truly to be made, we
do bind ourselves, and each of us, for and in the whole, our and each of our heirs, executors and ad-
ministrators, jointly and severally by these presents. Sealed with our seals, and dated the *thirteenth*
day of December *1820*

The condition of this obligation is such, That if the within bounded *Alvin Stocking and Alvin*
Joslin administrator of all and singular the goods, chattles and credits of *Alvin Stocking*

deceased, do make, or cause to be made, a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods, chat-
tles and credits of the said deceased, which have or shall come to the hands, possession or knowledge of
them, the said *Alvin Stocking & Alvin Joslin* or into the hands, and possession of any other per-
son or persons, for ~~them~~ and the same, so made, do exhibit, or cause to be exhibited, into the register's
office, in the county of Bradford, at or before the *thirteenth* day of *January*
next ensuing; and the same goods, chattles and credits, and all the other goods, chattles and credits of
the said deceased, at the time of his death, which at any time after shall come to the hands or pos-
session of any other person or persons for ~~them~~ do well and truly administer according to law; and fur-
ther do make, or cause to be made, a true and just account of ~~the~~ said administration, at or before the
thirteenth day of *January 1821* and all the rest and residue of the
the said goods, chattles and credits, which shall be found remaining upon the said administrator's ac-
count, the same being first examined and allowed of, by the orphans court of the county where the said
administration is granted, shall deliver and pay unto such person or persons, respectively, as the said
orphans court, by their decree or sentence, pursuant to the true intent and meaning of this act, shall
limit and appoint; and if it shall hereafter appear that any last will and testament was made by the
deceased, and the executor or executors therein named do exhibit the same into the said register's office,
making request to have it allowed and approved accordingly, if the said administrator within boun-
den, being thereunto required, do render and deliver the said letters of administration, approbation of
such testament being first had and made, in the said register's office, then this obligation to be void and
of no effect, or else to remain in full force and virtue.

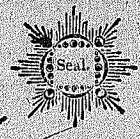
